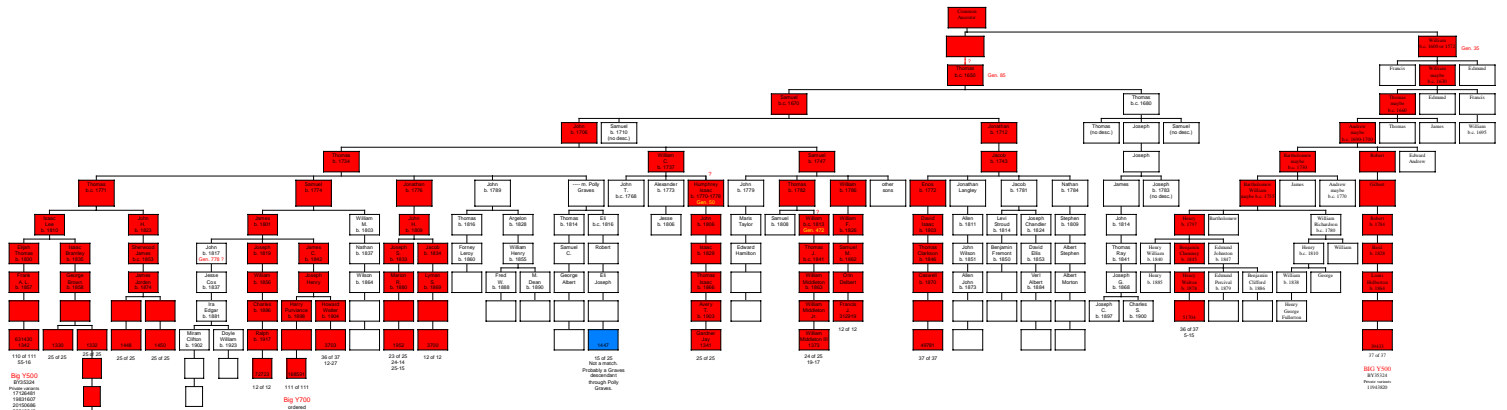


Connections for Graves Family of Drogheda, Co. Louth, Ireland (Gen. 35) and Thomas Graves of New Castle Co., DE (Gen. 85)

**NOTE:** This chart shows male lines of descent only, since the focus is on using Y-DNA to trace the Graves surname. The chart is not a pedigree chart. It is a chart of descent, not a chart of lineage. When two descendants of a common ancestor have exactly the same DNA test results, it is assumed that they are either brothers or sons, and all lines up and including the common ancestor have been given the same color. All names with the same color have the same DNA test results. An 'x' at the end of a line or at the end of a name indicates a mutation from the ancestral haplotype, and means that the line is not of the Graves family. To substantiate sibling linkages and to make connections to other parts of the family, including the entire ancestry, it is important for every descendant to participate in the DNA study and for those who have already been part to update their tests to 37 markers. Based on current knowledge, it is possible that Thomas Graves of New Castle Co., DE, was descended from William Graves of Drogheda, but it is probably more likely that they were both descended from an earlier ancestor, as shown on this chart.
